7. Bake for 15-20 minutes or until golden brown.

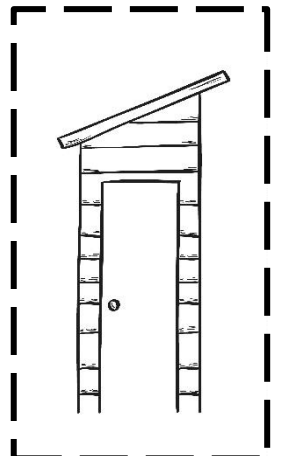
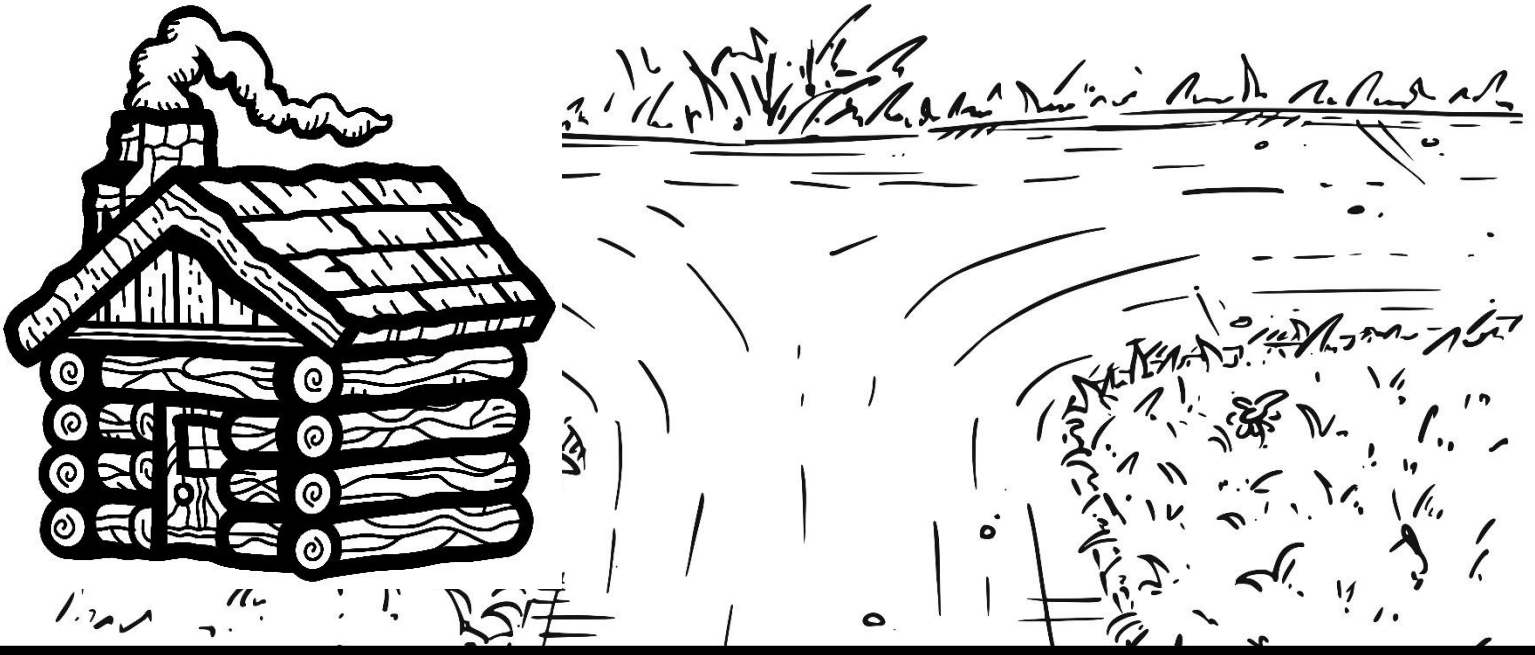
