




The <u>Pilgrims</u> were from England. They were the first people from Europe to move to America and start a <u>settlement</u>.

The <u>Pilgrims</u> moved to America because they didn't like the law about **religion** in England. The law was that there was only one religion. It was the Church of England.





The <u>Pilgrims</u> called themselves **Separatists**. That is because they did not like the Church of England, and so they separated from it.

They started a new religion.

The <u>Pilgrims</u> asked **King James** to change the rule about only having one church. King James said, "NO". The Pilgrims could not have their own church in England.

The <u>Pilgrims</u> decided to move to America. They could build their own churches there. They sailed across the Atlantic Ocean on a ship called the **Mayflower**.




The <u>Pilgrims</u> needed rules for their new <u>settlement</u>. The rules were called the **Mayflower Compact**. The Pilgrims signed it before they got off the ship.





The <u>Pilgrims</u> landed in Massachusetts in December of 1620. The Pilgrims stepped on a rock to get off the ship. They named it **Plymouth Rock**. They called their <u>settlement</u> Plymouth.

There were no cities in **Plymouth**, **Massachusetts**. There were no houses, stores, or doctors. The <u>Pilgrims</u> had to build their <u>settlement</u> in the forest.




The <u>Pilgrims</u> lived on the ship that first **winter**. They worked on building houses and barns. They did not have a lot of food.





It was very cold that first winter. A lot of <u>Pilgrims</u> got pneumonia. Many Pilgrims got sick and died. It was hard living in the new <u>settlement</u>.





The next spring, the <u>Pilgrims</u> had to grow their own food. They needed help. **Squanto** was a Native American. He taught the Pilgrims how to grow corn and other vegetables.


The gardens grew all summer. In the fall, the <u>Pilgrims</u> had a good <u>harvest</u>. They had food to eat.





The Native Americans helped the <u>Pilgrims</u> survive that first year. The Pilgrims were very grateful.
