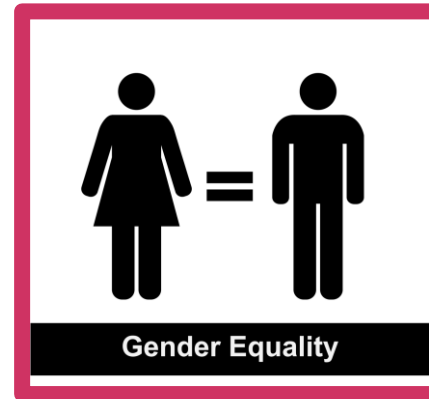
People at a march walk or stand. They hold signs that say why they are mad. They want everyone to know about problems that need to be fixed.

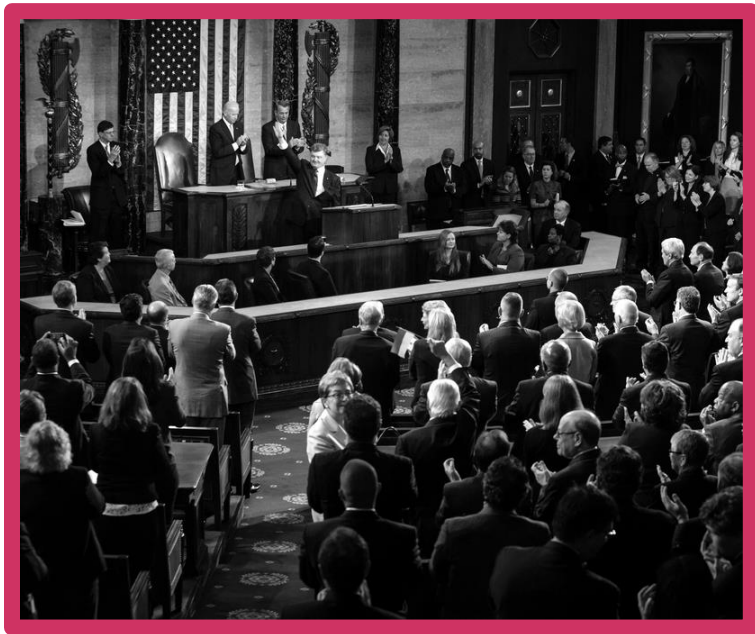

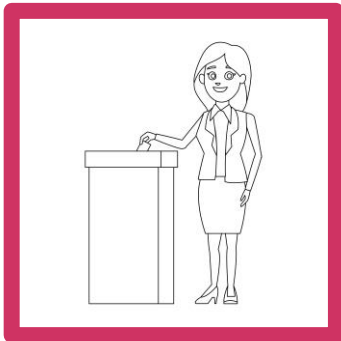
