


## Cricket Bread for Sale

Crickets are insects. Most people think eating crickets is disgusting!





The crickets used in the bread are farm-raised in cages. The cricket farmers feed the crickets healthy food.




When the crickets are 7 weeks old, the cricket farmers freeze the crickets and sell them to a mill.



The mill grinds the crickets into powder. The powder is then sold to places that use cricket powder to make food.



Here are 70 squares.



Each loaf of cricket bread has about 70 crickets in it. Crickets are very healthy for people to eat.
