


People have parts. The head, arms, legs, and feet are parts. What other body parts can you think of?




Plants have parts. One part is roots. The roots hold the plant in the ground.

Do you water plants?




Plants have a **stem**. The stem

Water and nutrients go up the stem. What happens if plants don't get water?




Leaves grow at the end of stems. What leaves do people eat in salads?
